Lesson #: 1

Theme of Lesson: Teamwork!
Restating of Guiding Question:

How can students learn to work as a team?

How can students create a visual representation of teamwork?

**Opening Ritual** All students meet in a circle; give their name and a feeling. We will then set an intention for today's class.

**Objective:** Learn to identify a feeling, recognizing the diversity of the room. Orient the students for today's lesson. Popcorn activity will make children be comfortable with speaking aloud and does not put pressure on them to speak.

**Activity Name:** Centering

**Brief Description:** Each student will go around to say how they are feeling today. Circle will end with setting the intention for that lesson. Introduce popcorn activity- students will "pop" like a bag of popcorn.

## Intro Activity

Objective: Identify and understand teamwork

**Activity Name:** What is teamwork?

**Brief Description:** After reading several stories and quotes, students brainstorm words that represent teamwork to them.

Main Exercise

Objective: Create a visual representation of teamwork

**Activity Name:** Partnership & art

**Brief Description:** Students will be presented with art work and photographs that show team work in a variety of cultures. In groups, using three words that were brainstormed, or making new ones, they will create a visual representation of their team.

## Closing Ritual

Objective: Verbal assessment of what they learned

**Activity Name: One word** 

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**Brief Description:** Students will name one thing they are taking away from today's lesson. We will close with a chant (peace begins with me) that is affirming to self and to our friends. (The light in me bows to the light in you)
