Lesson # 2

(Our mock residency consists of 11 sessions during one semester)

Theme: "ANANSI THE SPIDER" (Folk + Mythology story)

TA(Maya): Our General Inquiry question is:

How do we use poetry, rhythm, movement and theater to enhance the experience of community for grades: 2 & 3?

TA(Kim):

What is the goal of this particular session?

Show community, sharing and creating poems inspired by the story of Anansi the spider; show new ways to create a poem(s)

General Objective:

How do we build in class community by using African Folk story, create poetry and eventually connect everyone into a web

LESSON BEGINS:

TA, Maya + Kim give out handouts:

Opening ritual

Objective: Moving together, feeling each other side by side: unity Activity name: Do you think that you can move?

TA (Maya) calls with a drum (call and response) everyone into a circle (8 counts) (Music intelligence, kinesthetic intelligence) TA (Kim) joins

Movement: 4 counts segments -kinesthetic intelligence



- 1. Reach to the sun
- 2. Bow to the earth
- 3. Stretch to sides (like crescent)
- 4. Circle (around oneself) and rest
- 5. Reach to the sun
- 6. Lean back to the wall (Right side)
- 7. Lean back to the wall (Left side)
- 8. Arms in the circle (in front) and rest

Intro Activity

Objective: geography and animals of Africa versus America Activity name: What are our favorite animals?

TA (Maya) will use the Globe: America versus Africa (how do we get there - distance) - America states - Africa 54 countries, population of 1.111 billion. 2000 languages

TA (Kim) - Movement of animals (Maya drum - 8 counts for each animal) Giraffe + Elephant + Crocodile + Lion

(In the actual class - A child calls an animal - interpersonal intelligence - In Rhythm - they create - Animal statues - transition into next statue (with rhythm clap) - every child calls for an animal kinesthetic intelligence - stretch, power, grounding, intent)

Main Activity

Objective:

The students will learn about Africa, Anansi, characters, and create poems (sentence) based in question posed by TA; syllables + words Activity name: Our community

TA (Kim) starts to read Synopsis: followed by every student reads a sentence or a word.

ANANSI THE SPIDER, is a story from Ghana, from the Ashanti people. In the story, a father spider gets lost and his 6 sons help him get back home (The names of the sons are: See Trouble - Road Builder, River Drinker, Game Skinner, Stone Thrower and Cushion); His sons find Anansi and save him. Anansi wants to give a prize to the son who rescued him. He has a white globe of light, but which son to give it too? The sons fight over it all night and then Nyame, the god of all things sends the ball of light to the night sky, to become the moon, which the spider sons can see and share along with the rest of the people on earth.)

TA (MAYA)

Anansi characters: God Nyame, Moon, Fish, Falcon ANANSI'S SONS -uses djembe See Trouble, Road Boulder, River Drinker, Game Skinner **Stone Thrower (Movement example)** Cushion

TA (KIM): hand out the questions - base to a poem

- 1. Repetition: of syllables + words
- 2. Each child finds a word that repeats or rhymes

What kind of noise does a river make when you walk into it The river gurgles *What rhymes It also goes swish swish *What rhymes

When river drinker sucks up the entire river is his tummy full? Is his tummy heavy?

How do you feel when you lay down on a soft cushion? I feel like resting there and going to sleep. *What rymes?

What does your arm feel like when you throw a stone? What do you use to build a road? How do you think Anansi feels flying through the sky in the hawk's talons? When the hawk comes along, it takes Anansi far, far away. *What rhymes?

MAYA The poem that we create is repeated with the drum

Closing ritual

Objective: to encourage strength and power in every individual Activity name: we are united

On count 8 we form the circle again. Roll the yarn to each other and build the WEB At the end each person is able to use the words:

I have a voice



My voice is powerful My vice will change the world

Community

Rhythm, repetition, imagination, improvisation, literacy, listening
