We are a diverse group of working and stay-at-home moms who have something simple and profound in common: We care. Through SuperMoms Collective, we come together to socialize and help the arts-in-education organization Community-Word Project (CWP) keep up its critical work of bringing creative resources to the children in our own backyard who need it most. The children we support were born into challenging circumstances and lack of opportunities in their hard-hit communities. We think it's important to bring interesting and interested New York City moms together to reach out to help kids who need our creativity and support.



### About Community-Word Project:

Community-Word Project's (CWP) mission is to inspire children in underserved communities to read, interpret and respond to their world and to become active citizens through collaborative arts residencies and teacher training programs.

CWP believes that all children have the right to a learning environment that teaches them not what to think, but how to think.

We achieve this goal through arts residencies for public school students and a comprehensive Teaching Artist Training & Internship Program (TATIP), the only one of its kind. In a CWP classroom, two professionally trained Teaching Artists work in collaboration with the classroom teacher to help students develop leadership, creative, and literacy skills by writing poetry, painting murals, and staging performances.



Since 1997, CWP has helped over 18,000 young people develop the skills to be successful in school and in life. In 2015-16, we will work with over 2,000 students in struggling New York City communities.
